Learning highlights this week...

Every week there are many learning highlights and I particularly enjoy our 'Innovate' weeks at the end of the half term topic when the children apply the knowledge they have learned. I know that Acorns are learning lots about the human skeleton and have impressed me with their recall of names of bones. Year One and Two have learned so much about life in Victorian schools. In Year Three/Four they have worked in teams to produce information and models about tombs of Pharaohs and finally Year Five and Six have pulled together all their knowledge from not only this year but previous years, to explain a range of scientific processes. Well done everyone!

Next week is one of our themed weeks and Acorns will be continuing with 'Funny Bones' and creating a puppet show of the story. Year One and Two are immersing themselves in reading and also RE! Further up the school, Year Three and Four are looking at the significance of the Stone Age so they can gain a better sense of how this period impacted on the development of civilisation. In Year Five and Six they are delving into a deeper understanding of the concept of monarchy and building on lots of prior knowledge about Kings and Queens they have already learned about. It looks to be an exciting week to end the half term!

Update from Miss Little EYFS Leader

This week we are continuing with our 'All About Me' topic by learning about our bodies. We have been reading the story 'Funny Bones' and now know that we all have skeletons inside us. Sam, the friendly skeleton, has paid us a visit and he has been helping us learn some of the bones in our bodies including skull, ribs, spine and thigh bones. The doctors and nurses have come to the role play and we have been learning about x-rays and consolidating our knowledge of the different bones. We have been writing prescriptions for patients and learning how we use gentle and kind hands to look after others. Ted is having an x-ray here whilst Doctor Luna-Belle talks him through the results!







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Acorns have also started to come to our Reflections with the rest of the school and have done so well! Remember after half term they will be joining in with the Friday KS1 Star Assemblies too so I am sure parents will look forward to coming to them as well.

This week we have been doing our Innovates. Each group took a different aspect of Victorian school life and created props, role plays and presentations to share their learning with Acorns. Children were able to make comparisons between school life now and in the past!

We were really excited to discover some photos of High Ash from Victorian times and this really helped to bring our learning to life!


Year Three and Four



Our older children have also spent time this week doing paired reading with children in KS1!




Year Five/Six
