Miss Little and the team have worked hard over the Summer to update the outdoor learning area and we love our new play sheds!










Update from Miss Little (EYFS Leader)....


As Headteacher, I have been proud to see some super work from Rosie

Year Three and Four

Update from Miss Raval- Year Three/Four Leader...

The Year3/4 children have made a positive start to the term. They began the week by recapping the terms 'adjectives' and 'nouns' to describe themselves through a describing bubble. During their Maths work, they have been busy partitioning 2,3 and 4 digit numbers and recombining them, as well as developing their knowledge of times tables. A key highlight of the week was their Ancient Egyptian Hook Day, where the children understood the process of mummification and performed this themselves using an orange. Finally, they enjoyed learning how to write their names in hieroglyphics on papyrus paper.
