To all our families,

Welcome to December and Advent as we officially countdown to Christmas! I do hope you found the Christmas planner that I sent home in last week's newsletter useful and do keep referring to it.

### *Christmas Tree Walk and outdoor Advent Services....*

Today, after a break of a couple of years due to storms and then COVID19, our annual Christmas Tree Walk returned! This is a lovely community event to mark the start of Advent at our school and many thanks to Alders Fisheries for the donation of the tree.

This morning, our KS2 children and parents walked to the woods to then have an outdoor Advent Service, carols and prayers led by the children before we then had the tree brought back to school to decorate.

This year, in line with our Christmas Appeal, we will be decorating it with orange love hearts and stars with our messages and prayers of support for children who are refugees and as a way of raising awareness for our support of our charity World Vision.

Then this afternoon, Foundation and Key Stage One held their Advent Service on the school field. This also involved planting a new tree in part to replace the one we have had cut down as the Christmas Tree and in part due to having a tree to plant in early celebration of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee.

It was wonderful to have parents attend these events and thank you to all parents for following our COVID protocols, although the main protective factor was being outside.

### *Nativity Updates...*


There has been much attention in the press and on TV about school Nativities and them going ahead in the light of the new Omicron variant.

We have taken advice from the DFE and also from Public Health England to risk assess and at this stage we believe the measures we have in place and current low case numbers in school, mean we can still go ahead with the Nativities next week as planned.

However, the caveat is that we still reserve the right to change this if there is a significant increase in cases in school.

To ensure we mitigate this, can I just remind parents attending the Nativities of the protocols that must be followed:

1. All parents must wear a face mask for the duration of the performance
2. Only parents who have booked seats will be admitted. We have significantly reduced audience numbers to ensure we can space out seats
3. Please can parents complete a lateral flow test at least 24 hours before attending
4. Please do not attend if you have any COVID symptoms or feel unwell

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5. Please keep seats spaced out as they will be in the hall
  6. Please wrap up warm as we will have windows open for ventilation.

Many thanks for your continued support with this as parents have been brilliant throughout this pandemic in following our risk mitigation measures.

#### *Please ensure children attend our evening Nativity performances...*

Anecdotally, some of our children have been saying they will not be able to come back to school for the evening performances as they have swimming, football clubs etc. I would just really like to ask parents to work with us and ensure that children do attend (if well) to the performances as it would be such a shame after all the effort we are putting in to lay them on if then actors are missing! Thank you. Your child will need to be in school for 5:10pm until 6:10pm for the evening shows which is not too long a time.

#### *Reflections....*

Last week in Reflections our Charity Leaders launched our Christmas Appeal to support refugees abroad through World Vision. It is part of our desire to live out our vision by being advocates for change and letting our light shine on key issues that matter to the children. As well as fundraising, they will also be looking at ways to raise awareness of this issue with the Government.




Well done also to Imogen, Roseanna, Malachi and Harry B for their amazing instructions about how to trap the Iron Man!
