Reading Books in Foundation and Year One...

Just to clarify, for children in Foundation and Year One- they will be coming home with two reading books. One book (and for Foundation this will be in a few weeks when they have learnt enough sounds) will be a their Book Bag Book linked to the phonics they know. This is the book your child will read to you as it is based on sounds they know. This is the same as we have done previously.

They will also bring home a library book that they have chosen that they would like an adult to read to them. This is important to develop their love of reading as well as their language development. Foundation have already started this and Year One children will be starting this up from next week after their library time.

Learning highlights this week...

<u>Acorns and Saplings-</u> The learning this week has been focused around the 'Colour Monster' and the children have looked at how to mix colours by experimenting with mixing paints to create their own monsters. Thank you to Dixie and Annabella for sharing what colours they made! Frankie and Amelia T enjoyed telling me about their learning and for recognising colours and numbers when counting. This week the children have been exploring their understanding of the number 3 and also finding out how many different ways they can make 3.

I also saw their Phonics sessions this week and all the groups have quickly settled into their routines and already have learnt lots of initial sounds!



In Maths, Theo, Charlie, Jad and William had impressed their teacher with their problem solving in Maths using number bonds to 10 and 20- super effort! Fabian and Summer also came to share their Maths learning too and very proud they were as well!

Next week, Year One children will also be bringing home a reading book for you to read to your child as well as the reading book they have linked to their phonics. Thank you for supporting us at home with this.

<u>Year Three and Four-</u> The children are working so hard in Year Three and Four and every time I go to classes they are so engaged in their learning. Thank you to Roman, Eliza, Alfie K, Darcey, Jerrold, Sophie H, Gianna, Thomas, Miles, Alfie M who did a fantastic job in telling me and Mrs Goodger all about their learning in Topic and in English and about their class novel- wow!







In Guided Reading, the children have been developing their comprehension skills by having to work out the questions from the answers they were given! Miss Woods sent Alissa and Roman with Gold Stars as they had persevered with this and really worked hard!

In RE this week, the classes have been reflecting on how to care for the environment as God intended. Here are some photos from the RE lessons of the children putting this message into action!





Year Five and Six- I also enjoyed spending time with children from all three classes to find out about their learning so far this term and how they could link it to learning from previous years. Thank you to Amaya, Jenson, Ben, Sam, Lucy, Jacob, Mollie, Jake, Jack B, Harry, Alex H, Archie, Samina, Laurence and Isabella who were able to talk to me about how they draft and redraft their writing in English and all about the key inventors and reformers they had learnt about in Victorian England!

Bryce and Ayrton had gold stars for their reasoning skills in Maths solving 'Always, Sometimes, Never True' statements linked to factors and multiples. The classes were also completing an online maths challenge so they could apply their knowledge of this and also recall quickly their times table knowledge to help them. Xanthe was working on the subtraction written method and had written a very detailed explanation on how she had arrived at her answer! I am very proud of you all!

Thinking ahead to Harvest...

Our Year/Three and Four children will be taking our Harvest Service in Church this year, with the rest of school celebrating at school. As a reminder, the diary date for our Harvest Service is Wednesday 13th October @ 1.45pm and parents are welcome too. This year our Harvest theme is linked to the Oxford Diocesean campaign for 'Be The Change' linked to challenging inequality in the world and we are looking at this in the context of aiming to reduce hunger in not only the UK but the wider world. We are also linking this to our learning on Fair Trade which the Year Three/Four classes have been learning about this half term and linking it to the 'Feeding of the 5000' in the Bible.

Clubs....

We are working back up to being able to offer activities either at lunchtime or after school from after half term. Most of the activities run by staff will now be at a lunchtime as it means we can include more children who cannot always attend after school. These activities remain free of course!

Mrs Gray will be starting up choir again after school for up to 30 KS2 children and Miss Buckingham will be starting a KS1 Choir at lunchtime. We will be offering other sports activities at lunchtime too. Commando Joe will have an after school club (currently by invitation) and we are in the process of sourcing an Art Club and a Dance Club so watch this space! We will still be providing sports coaches for WRAP after school as part of the WRAP offer and included in the price, as this has proved popular and gets the children active in a wider range of physical activity.
