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Year Five and Six-


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Here is a quick round up of learning in Year Five and Six this week!

- Social experiment: Our teachers took on the role of someone who was prejudice against eye colour. Some of us got treated unfairly and didn't have as much fun! This got us to think about how their discrimination based on gender, ethnicity, religion, identity, appearance and race exists in the world.
- Historical time line: In groups, we ordered key periods in order and added facts.
- Blue plaques: We learnt about the significance of blue plaques and how 4% of the 1000 plaques in London currently represent people who are of Black Asian and Minority Ethnic (BAME).
- We then designed a blue plaque for a Victorian or for someone who may be entitled to one in the future ©
