









<u>English</u>		<u>Maths</u>																																
In English we will be starting off with looking at and writing our own Roman Myths! Thinking about how we can write in the style of a Myth and create a fantastic narrative. We will also be looking at writing letters from the perspective of a gladiator. Finding out how to make our letters exciting, using informal language and understanding how the Gladiators would have been feeling while writing.		In Maths, Year 3 will be starting with Multiplication and Division and then moving onto length and perimeter. In Year 4 we will also be starting with multiplication and division and then moving onto fractions.																																
<u>Hook Day</u>																																		
For our hook day we will be looking at the Roman Empire, understanding how it spread over the reign of different emperors, finding it and drawing it on a current map of Europe. We will also be making our own mosaic tiles! First looking at what the mosaics meant to the Romans and understanding why and how they created them.																																		
<u>History</u>																																		
In this topic we will be learning all about Roman gladiators! We will learn about the origins of gladiator fighting and develop our understanding of how gladiators were trained, what they wore, what they ate, how they fought and the gruesome tasks they were set by emperors. We will also be comparing famous Roman gladiators and thinking about which characteristics made them so successful against their opponents in the Amphitheatre.																																		
<u>Science</u>																																		
In Science, we will be learning about light. We will learn about how light travels from a light source and how it enables us to see objects. We will study shadows and what happens to light when it travels through transparent and translucent or opaque materials. We will also be learning about when light reflects.
