Privacy Notice - How We Use Personal Information about Governors (including Get Information About Schools - GIAS)

The Categories of Governance Information That We Process Include:

- personal identifiers, contacts and characteristics (such as name, date of birth, contact details and postcode)
- governance details (such as role, start and end dates and governor ID)
- safeguarding requirements (such as DBS, ID, prohibition from management)

Why We Collect and Use Governance Information

The personal data collected is essential, in order for the school to fulfil their official functions and meet legal requirements.

We collect and use governance information, for the following purposes:

- a) To meet the statutory duties placed upon us
- b) Establish and maintain effective governance
- c) Facilitate safe recruitment, as part of our safeguarding obligations towards pupils
- d) Undertake equalities monitoring

Under the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), the legal bases we rely on for processing personal information for general purposes are:

- for the purpose a) and c) named above in accordance with the legal basis of Legal Obligation
- For the purposes of b) and d) , in accordance with the ‘public task’ basis – we need to process data to fulfil our statutory function as a school

All maintained school governing bodies, under section 538 of the Education Act 1996 have a legal duty to provide the governance information as detailed above.

We process criminal offence data under Article 10 of the GDPR.

Our Data Protection Policy highlights the conditions for processing in Schedule 1 of the Data Protection Act 2018 that we process Special Category and Criminal Offence data under.

Collecting Governance Information

Governance data is essential for the school’s operational use. Whilst the majority of personal information you provide to us is mandatory, some of it may be requested on a voluntary basis. In order to comply with UK GDPR, we will inform you at the point of collection, whether you are required to provide certain information to us or if you have a choice in this.

Storing Governance Information

We hold data securely for the set amount of time shown in our data retention schedule. For more information on our data retention schedule and how we keep your data safe.

Who We Share Governance Information With

We routinely share this information with:

- our local authority (where applicable)
- the Department for Education (DfE)

Why We Share Governance Information

We do not share information about individuals in governance roles with anyone without consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so.

Local Authority

We are required to share information about our governors with our local authority (LA) in order to meet our legal obligations to share certain information with it, such as safeguarding concerns.

Department for Education (DfE)

The Department for Education (DfE) collects personal data from educational settings and local authorities. We are required to share information about individuals in governance roles with the Department for Education (DfE), under:

Requesting Access to Your Personal Data

Under data protection legislation, you have the right to request access to information about you that we hold. To make a request for your personal information, contact the School Business Manager in the first instance.

Depending on the lawful basis used for processing data (as identified above), you may also have the right to:

- have your personal data rectified if it is inaccurate or incomplete;
- request the deletion or removal of personal data where there is no compelling reason for its continued processing;
- restrict our processing of your personal data (i.e. permitting its storage but no further processing);
- object to direct marketing (including profiling) and processing for the purposes of scientific/historical research and statistics; or
- not be subject to decisions based purely on automated processing where it produces a legal or similarly significant effect on you.

If you have a concern or complaint about the way we are collecting or using your personal data, you should raise your concern with us in the first instance or directly to the Information Commissioner's Office at <https://ico.org.uk/concerns/>

Withdrawal of Consent and the Right to Lodge a Complaint

Where we process your personal data based on your consent, you have the right to withdraw that consent at any time.

To request the withdrawal of your consent, please contact the School Business Manager by email (businessmanager@highhashschool.co.uk). We will respond to your request promptly and ensure that your data is no longer processed on the basis of consent, unless another lawful basis applies.

Under Section 164A of the Data Protection Act 2018, you have a statutory right to complain if you believe your personal data has been handled inappropriately.

If you wish to raise a concern about how we process your personal data, please contact us directly at via our complaints procedure. We will acknowledge your complaint within 30 days of receipt and take appropriate steps to investigate and respond without undue delay.

How Government Uses Your Data

The governance data that we lawfully share with the Department for Education (DfE) via GIAS:

- will increase the transparency of governance arrangements
- will enable local authority maintained schools, academies, academy trusts and the Department for Education (DfE) to identify more quickly and accurately individuals who are involved in governance and who govern in more than one context
- allows the Department for Education (DfE) to be able to uniquely identify an individual and in a small number of cases conduct checks to confirm their suitability for this important and influential role

Data Collection Requirements

Some of these personal data items are not publicly available and are encrypted within the GIAS system. Access is restricted to authorised Department for Education (DfE) and education establishment users with a Department for Education (DfE) Sign-in (DSI) account who need to see it in order to fulfil their official duties. The information is for internal purposes only and not shared beyond the Department for Education (DfE) unless the law allows it.

How to Find Out What Personal Information Department for Education (DfE) Hold About You

Under the terms of UK GDPR, you're entitled to ask the Department for Education (DfE):

- if they are processing your personal data
- for a description of the data they hold about you
- the reasons they're holding it and any recipient it may be disclosed to
- for a copy of your personal data and any details of its source
